WHEREAS; pediatric cancer is the leading cause of death by disease in children; and

WHEREAS; 1 in 285 children in the United States will be diagnosed by their 20th birthday; and

WHEREAS; 80 percent of childhood cancer cases are diagnosed only after the disease has metastasized

and spread to other areas of the body; and

WHEREAS; two-thirds of childhood cancer patients will have long-lasting chronic conditions as a result

of the treatments they go through; and

WHEREAS; there has been a 24 percent increase in pediatric cancer cases over the last 40 years, equal

to 43 children per day or 15,780 children a year diagnosed with cancer in the United States;

and

WHEREAS; the National Cancer Institute recognized the unique research needs of childhood cancer

and increased funding to conduct this research; and

WHEREAS; researchers and healthcare professionals work diligently to dedicate their expertise to treat

and cure children with cancer; and

WHEREAS; too many children are affected by this deadly disease and more must be done to raise

awareness and find a cure;
