### **Mayor Nelson Announces Upcoming Regular Neighborhood Zoom Meetings**

*Meetings kick off Oct. 15 with Five Corners/Chase Lake Area*

**(Edmonds, WA)** – Mayor Mike Nelson announced today that he is kicking off a series of Neighborhood Meetings, initially via Zoom, to listen to residents, share information about City projects, programs, and goals, and deliver updates unique to each of the neighborhoods that comprise our city of approximately 42,000 residents.

This first virtual meeting, via Zoom, will be focused on the Five Corners/Chase Lake area and will be held at **7:30 pm on Thursday, October 15<sup>th</sup>**. The Zoom link is:

“I want to listen to what is happening in your neighborhood and share with you the steps we are taking to move our city to a brighter future,” said Mayor Nelson. “As your Mayor one of my greatest desires is to connect with you in person. Since March we haven’t been able to meet, and that’s been really difficult. My hope is that through a regular schedule of neighborhood meetings – initially via Zoom – we will be able to reconnect and get a two-way conversation going again.”

The Mayor has indicated that, as soon as it’s possible, he would like to hold **in-person** meetings in areas around the City also.

The neighborhoods include:

- 5 Corners/Chase Lake

- Highway 99/Ballinger
- Firdale/Southwest Edmonds
- Westgate
- Perrinville/Northwest Edmonds/Olympic View Drive
- Seaview/Emerald Hills
- Meadowdale
- Pine Ridge/Maplewood Park
- The Bowl/Point Edwards.

While he has not determined the order yet, the Mayor will connect with every neighborhood via Zoom or in-person when possible.

At these meetings, the Mayor will share updates and ideas on big picture issues like COVID, economic recovery, the budget, crime and safety, and equity and social justice. He will open the floor to community comments and questions. Department directors may join the Mayor to provide updates and information about issues unique to each neighborhood.

*To get the conversation going, the City is asking residents in the **greater Five Corners/Chase Lake area to submit questions in advance**, especially if they may require research on our part.
